## PREFACE

This Ordinance in Revision is a complete codification of all Ordinances of a general and permanent nature enacted by the common Council. Special Ordinances or Ordinances dealing with only a portion of the inhabitants of the City, rather than all of them, or relating to special purposes are not included herein.

The source of each Section is included in the history note in parentheses at the end thereof. The absence of such a note indicates that the Section is new and was adopted for the first time by this Ordinance in Revision.

The numbering system used is the same system used in many state and municipal Codes. Each Section number consists of two component parts separated by a dash, the figure before the dash referring to the chapter number and the figure after the dash referring to the position of the Section within the chapter. Thus, the first Section of Chapter I is numbered I-1 and the second Section of Chapter 3 is 3-2. Under this system, each Section is identified with its chapter, and at the same time, new Sections can be inserted in their proper places simply by using the decimal system for amendments. By way of illustration: if new material consisting of three Sections that would logically come between Sections 4-4 and 4-5 is desired to be added, such new Sections would be numbered 4-4.1, 4-4.2, 4-4.3, respectively. Sections have been reserved at the end of articles and divisions to provide for future expansion.

New chapters may be included by the addition of a decimal after the chapter number, i.e., if the new material is to be included between Chapter 12 and 13, it will be designated as Chapter 12.5. Care should be taken that the alphabetical arrangement of chapters is maintained when including new chapters. New articles and new divisions may be included in the same way, or in the case of articles, may be placed at the end of the chapter embracing the subject, and in the case of divisions, maybe placed at the end of the article embracing the subject, the next successive number being assigned to the article or division.

The general index has been prepared with the greatest of care. Each particular item has been placed under several headings, some of the headings being couched in lay phraseology, others in legal terminology, and still others in language generally used by City officials and employees. There are numerous cross references within the index itself which stand as guideposts to direct users to any particular item in which they are interested.

NOW THEREFORE, I do hereby certify that the loose-leaf volume containing the Revised Ordinances of Madison, South Dakota, consists of Chapters 1 to 22; Appendixes A to B, both inclusive.

I FURTHER CERTIFY that if the volume or printed copy of the Revised Ordinances of Madison, South Dakota, in which this certificate appears contains the Chapters and Appendixes described and numbered as set forth above, it is a true, full, correct and complete copy of the Revised Ordinances of Madison, South Dakota.
